

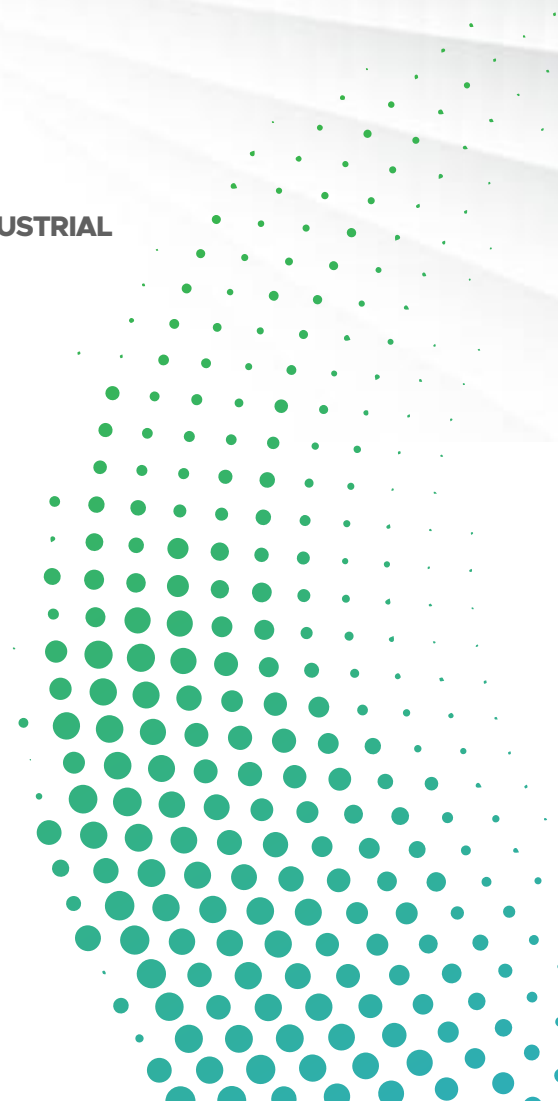

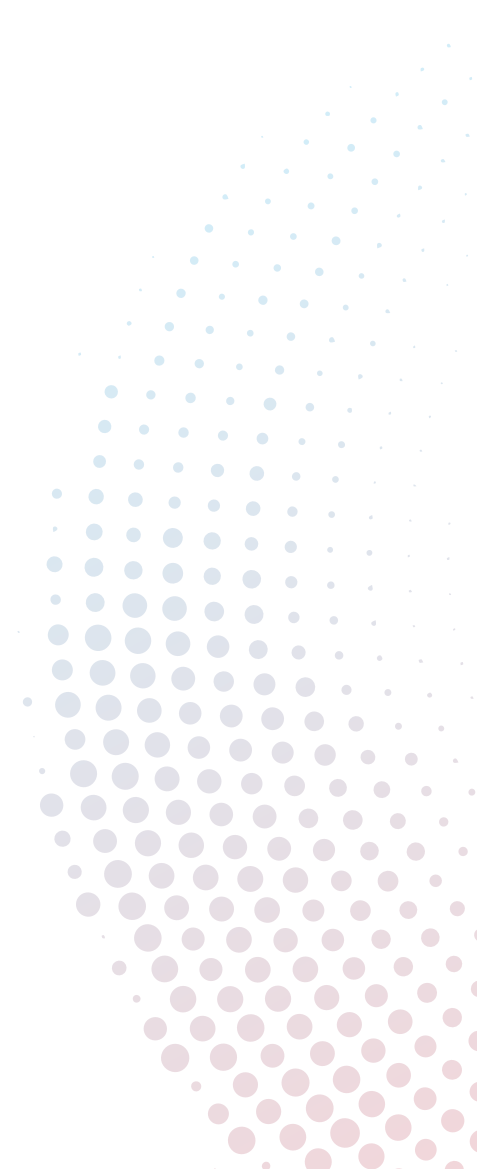
1. Morning sessions will have a key note address and a panel discussion (with Day 1 and day 2 having exhibition and Rapporteur's report respectively)

6. The Convenor shall establish a secretariate at the venue a day to symposium.

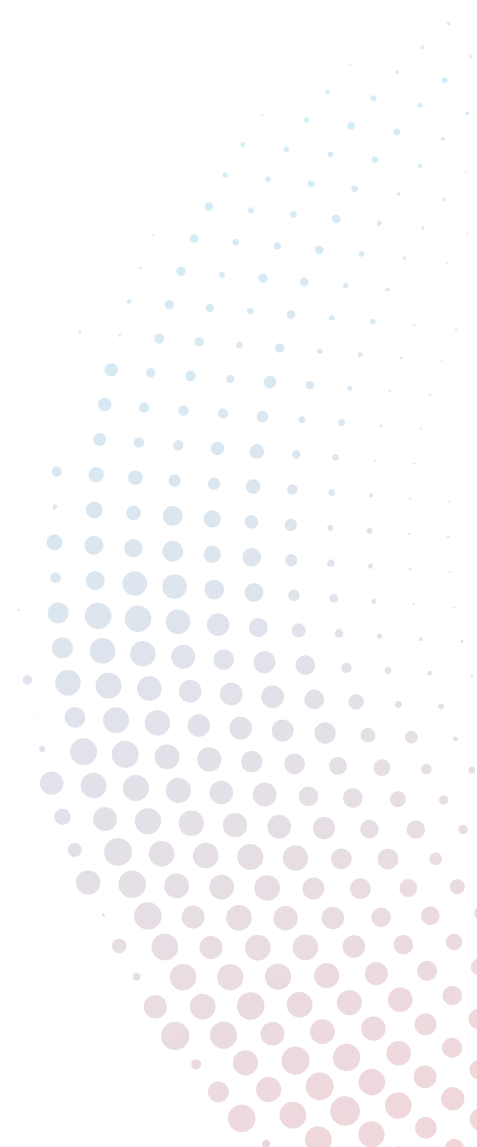
